One of the most unique facts about Dexter cattle is their extensive history. Of Irish origin, the Dexter was highly valued by peasant farmers of the 1800's, whose small land holdings provided marginal grazing in a tough climate. They found the naturally hardy Dexter to be the perfect provider of meat and milk.




Fig. 5.2. Dexter cow "Compton Dob", Source – J. Wilson, Standard Cyclopedia of Modern Agriculture, 7, 1910.

Dexters for Milk & Meat

Dexter Cattle are quite renowned for their suitability as house cows and are particularly well suited to small acre farms. Equally as remarkable, Dexter cattle continue to build a reputation for outstanding meat quality and carcass yield. Many judges have been quite surprised by the Dexter scores when judging carcass competitions as have the beef producers entering larger breeds.



Characteristics

Dexter cattle have their own unique and specific characteristics. The Dexter Breed Standard developed by DCAI is an excellent tool to help you assess Dexter cattle you may be considering for purchase. The traits the Dexter breed is known for are described in brief below.

- The coat colour: wholly black, red or dun
- The head should be relatively short and broad, tapering toward a broad muzzle with relatively large, open nostrils.
- Horns, if present, are white with a black tip, should be moderately thick with an inward and upward curve.

Though Dexters are naturally small, there is considerable variation in the height of Dexter cattle and this is allowed for in the Breed Standard.

- Cows: 91cm and 112cm
- Bulls: 97cm and 117cm
- Long-leg and short-leg are of equal merit

All Australian registered Dexter Cattle have been DNA tested for parent verification. Temperament should be considered when purchasing your cattle. It is always wise to view animals in person before committing to buying.

If you are inexperienced in selecting cattle take time to look at a number of studs and ask the advice of another breeder or experienced cattle person. The Dexter Breed standard is published in full on the DCAI website: dextercattle.org.au

Size & Temperament

Unlike many small breeds, Dexter Cattle are naturally small. They are not a miniaturized version of a larger breed. The manageable size of Dexter cattle make them an ideal choice for small farms. wide, sweeping forward and upwards, giving them a dramatic appearance. Many breeders choose to disbud their calves to prevent horns form developing. At some point in recent history a poll gene appeared in the genetic mix. Selective breeding has resulted in naturally polled Dexter cattle being relatively common in Australian Herds offering greater choice for Dexter Breeders.

Long & Short

The terms "Long-Leg' and "Short-Leg" when applied to Dexter cattle are not a reference to the height of the animal. They are colloquial terms adopted for describing animals carrying the chondrodysplasia dwarfing gene (short-leg) and those animals that do not (long-leg). It is not always easy to tell which is which just by looking at them with a passing glance.
